#### KEY PRODUCT FEATURES

##### WHAT ARE YOU INVESTING IN?

- You are investing in a sub-fund of a SICAV, which is an open-ended investment company constituted in Luxembourg.
- The Fund aims for long-term growth and preservation of capital with lower volatility of returns than Emerging Markets Equities by investing primarily in Investment Grade and High Yield Bonds (both corporates and sovereigns), Equity, hybrid securities and short-term instruments normally listed or traded on other regulated markets of issuers in Eligible Investment Countries.
- The Fund intends to recommend that dividends be distributed to Shareholders of all Dividend-distributing Equivalent Classes and Dividend-distributing Hedged Equivalent Classes (if any). You should note that the declaration and/or payment of dividends may be made out of capital and may have the effect of lowering the net asset value of the Fund.

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The Fund will invest primarily in Investment Grade and High Yield Bonds (both corporates and sovereigns), Equity, hybrid securities, and short-term instruments normally listed or traded on other regulated markets of issuers in Eligible Investment Countries.</li> <li>• Up to 10% of the Fund’s assets may be invested in securities of issuers which are not Emerging Markets Issuers. Notwithstanding the above 10% limit, the Fund may invest in debt instruments from issuers such as the US Treasury or other sovereign issuers that, in the opinion of the Investment Adviser, are of equivalent or higher quality, without being considered as securities of issuers from countries other than Eligible Investment Countries.</li> <li>• Unlisted securities may also be purchased subject to relevant provisions of Annex 1.</li> <li>• The Fund may use financial derivative instruments for investment purposes, hedging and/or efficient portfolio management. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>You are exposed to market risks as the Fund invests primarily in Equities.</b></li> </ul> <p>The prices of Equity securities may decline in response to certain events, including but not limited to those directly affecting the companies whose securities are owned by the Fund; conditions affecting the general economy; overall market changes; local, regional or global political, social or economic instability; and currency fluctuations.</p>	

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li><b>You are exposed to market risks in emerging markets.</b> The Fund faces a number of investment risks greater than those normally associated with investments in international securities. In particular, it may encounter settlement systems that are less well organised than those of developed markets. There may be risks that settlement may be delayed and that cash or securities belonging to the Fund may be in jeopardy because of failures of or defects in the systems or because of defects in the administrative operations of the counter-parties.</li> <li><b>You are exposed to market risks as the Fund invests primarily in bonds.</b> Market values of Bonds generally vary inversely with the level of interest rates – when interest rates rise, their values will tend to decline and vice versa. <b>Administrative Manager:</b>	J. P. Morgan SE, Luxembourg Branch
<b>ABS:</b>	asset-backed securities.
<b>Annex 1</b>	the section titled “General Investment Guidelines and Restrictions” in the Luxembourg Prospectus.
<b>Bond:</b>	any transferable fixed-income security (which may include fixed-income securities convertible into equity and/or having attached warrants).
<b>Business Day:</b>	a day (other than a Saturday, a Sunday or 24 December in each year) on which banks are generally open for business in Luxembourg or such other days as the Company may decide.
<b>CDS:</b>	credit default swap.
<b>CDXs:</b>	credit default swap index and iTraxx indices.
<b>Class:</b>	each class of Shares.
<b>Dealing Deadline:</b>	1:00 p.m. Luxembourg time on each Valuation Date.
<b>Dividend-distributing Equivalent Class:</b>	a class, the characteristics and features of which are equivalent to those of another Class, except as specifically described under the section headed “The Classes” of the Luxembourg Prospectus in respect of dividend distribution.
<b>Dividend-distributing Hedged Equivalent Class:</b>	a class, the characteristics and features of which are equivalent to those of another Class, except as specifically described under the section headed “The Classes” of the Luxembourg Prospectus in respect of dividend distribution and currency hedging.
<b>Eligible Investment Countries:</b>	Emerging Markets; countries rated Ba or lower or BB or lower by a nationally recognised statistical rating organisation; and countries that are on an International Monetary Fund (“IMF”) program, have outstanding liabilities to the IMF, or have exited an IMF program no more than 5 years earlier.
<b>Emerging Markets:</b>	countries that, in the opinion of the Investment Advisers, are generally considered to be developing countries by the international financial community.
<b>Emerging Markets Issuers:</b>	(1) issuers domiciled and/or having their principal place of business and/or whose securities are listed or traded in Emerging Markets; or (2) issuers having or expected to have significant economic exposure (e.g. through assets, revenues, or profits) to Emerging Markets; or (3) issuers of securities denominated in Emerging Markets currencies.
<b>Equities:</b>	any transferable equity and equity-related securities (including fixed income securities convertible into equity or having attached warrants, warrants, American Depository Receipts, Global Depository Receipts and preferred shares, all of which are considered equivalent to the underlying equity, as the case may be, for all intents and purposes).
<b>MBS:</b>	mortgage-backed securities.
<b>Net Asset Value:</b>	net asset value per Share.
<b>Share:</b>	share of the Fund.
<b>SICAV:</b>	<i>société d’investissement à capital variable</i> . It is a type of open-ended investment company in which the amount of capital in the fund varies according to the number of investors.
<b>USD:</b>	the currency of the United States of America.
<b>Valuation Date:</b>	each Business Day, except when (i) markets that represent 40% or more of the Fund’s portfolio, as determined towards the end of each year for the following year, are closed and/or (ii) two out of the following three markets are closed: the New York Stock

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	<p>Exchange, the Hong Kong Stock Exchange and the London Stock Exchange, at the time the Net Asset Value is calculated.
