What is this product? 本基金是甚麼產品？

The Fund is a sub-fund of Capital International Fund, which is a mutual fund domiciled in Luxembourg and its home regulator is the Commission de Surveillance du Secteur Financier (“CSSF”).

本基金是 Capital International 基金的子基金，Capital International 基金是設於盧森堡的互惠基金，其當地監管機構是盧森堡金融業監管委員會(Commission de Surveillance du Secteur Financier)(「盧森堡監委會」)。

Objectives and investment policy 目標及投資政策

The Fund seeks long-term growth of capital and conservation of principal through investing in equities and bonds issued by companies worldwide, which in the Investment Adviser’s opinion contribute positively to environmental and social objectives through their current or future products and/or services. The Fund also invests in other fixed-income securities, including government bonds, which meet the Investment Adviser’s proprietary eligibility criteria. In seeking to achieve its investment objective, at least 70% of the Fund’s investments in equities and bonds align with environmental and/or social characteristics.

The Fund seeks to invest in companies whose products and services are majority-aligned, or transitioning towards higher positive alignment, with the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (“SDGs”). In addition to SDG alignment, each company aligns to any single or combination of sustainable investment themes (“Themes”) focused on global social and environmental challenges as identified by the Investment Adviser. Such Themes map to the SDGs, which provide a blueprint to achieve sustainable development across economic, social and environmental aspects:

- (i) **Health & wellbeing.** *Promotes healthy lives and well-being;*
- (ii) **Energy transition.** *Ensures access to affordable, reliable and sustainable energy;*
- (iii) **Sustainable cities & communities.** *Supports urbanisation in an inclusive, sustainable way;*
- (iv) **Responsible consumption & production.** *Supports the transition to a circular and sustainable economy;*
- (v) **Education & information access.** *Ensures inclusive, quality education and information access;*
- (vi) **Financial inclusion.** *Increases access and affordability of financial services and marketplaces; and*
- (vii) **Clean water and sanitation.** *Ensures availability and sustainable management of water and sanitation.*

The above Themes may change over time based on the Investment Adviser’s research and/or views.

The Fund commits to maintain at least 40% of its investments in sustainable investments (i) which are assessed based on alignment of business activities with any one or a combination of the Themes as mentioned above; and (ii) which do not cause any significant harm to any environmental or social sustainable investment objectives.

Eligibility of companies

To identify eligible companies that are considered to be majority “aligned” with or “transitioning” towards higher alignment with the SDGs, the Investment Adviser performs an assessment that relies on bottom-up proprietary research. This eligibility assessment is underpinned by the Investment Adviser’s sector-level “Characteristics” (which assess whether products and services within a sector contribute positively to the SDGs) and “Standards” (which examine how products and services are produced, the management of material ESG risks, the quality of corporate governance practices and any adverse environmental or social impacts). The Investment Adviser typically uses revenue to assess business alignment, however in some instances other metrics may be more relevant (e.g. energy production mix for utilities). The Investment Adviser also takes into consideration topics, communities, and groups not specifically referenced in the SDGs.

The Investment Adviser also assesses the risks of misalignment to the SDGs. If these risks are deemed material, the company may not be deemed eligible.

- (i) “Aligned” companies (“**Aligned Companies**”) are typically those companies which generate at least 50% of its revenue from products or services that are aligned with the Fund’s Themes as set out above. It is believed

that Aligned Companies can have significant positive impact on environmental and social goals. Some are naturally aligned through their products and services and can have significant positive impact given their size, scale and market presence, while others are successful industry disruptors and innovators whose business activities focus on solving unmet needs or addressing under-served populations.

- (ii) “Transitioning” companies (“**Transitioning Companies**”) are those that the Investment Adviser believes are actively transitioning their business to higher positive SDG alignment over the long-term, with material near-to-medium term change expected. Transitioning Companies may have low current business alignment today but may be making significant investments into innovative solutions that could be transformational or seeking to make meaningful changes that increase positive alignment to the SDGs and will likely have a growing contribution to global sustainable development. For Transitioning Companies in particular, specific targets, development pathways and timeline to reach intended transition are also considered.

If a company is determined to be “aligned” or “transitioning” and invested into by the Fund, but subsequently determined to fail to meet the “aligned” or “transitioning” requirements thereafter the company would generally be sold within six months from the date of such determination, subject to the best interests of investors in the Fund.

The Investment Adviser identifies relevant key performance indicators (KPIs) and targets to monitor progress and alignment to the SDGs. These will vary depending on the sector, the relevant Theme(s) and company. A company’s eligibility is monitored on an ongoing basis and there is a more formal “refresh” of impact thesis that occurs broadly annually. For transitioning companies in particular, KPIs may include aligned revenue, as well as other transition metrics.

In addition, the Investment Adviser applies ESG and norms-based exclusions to implement a Negative Screening Policy¹ relating to the Fund’s investments on corporate issuers at the time of purchase. The Investment Adviser relies on third-party providers who identify a company’s participation in, or the revenue which they derive from, activities that are inconsistent with these screens. As part of this, the Investment Adviser excludes companies violating the United Nations Global Compact (UNGC) principles as well as certain companies that are involved in business activities including weapons, tobacco and fossil fuels.

Eligibility of government bonds

Eligibility of government bonds is primarily assessed through the Investment Adviser’s proprietary sovereign ESG framework (the “**Framework**”), which covers a range of ESG indicators to evaluate how well a country manages its ESG risk, for example indicators related to climate change vulnerability, dimensions of human development and various measures of governance.

The Framework draws on raw scores from three data sources:

- 1) Environmental: The Notre Dame Global Adaptation Initiative Climate Vulnerability Index;
- 2) Social: UN Human Development Index; and
- 3) Governance: World Bank’s Worldwide Governance Indicators.

The Investment Adviser standardises the raw scores and assigns weightings to each of the Environmental, Social and Governance inputs to calculate overall ESG scores for a sovereign on both an absolute and a gross national income-adjusted (“**GNI-adjusted**”) basis, where data is available. To be eligible for investment, governments must fulfil the following criteria: 1) score above pre-determined thresholds for their ESG scores on an absolute and GNI-adjusted basis; 2) score above pre-determined governance score thresholds on an absolute and GNI-adjusted basis; and 3) fulfil certain human rights criteria as specified by the Investment Adviser. Government-related issuers determined to be outliers in terms of low scores are excluded from the Fund’s investment universe.

In addition, the Investment Adviser applies ESG exclusions to implement a negative screening policy² to the Fund’s investments in governments at the time of purchase.

Bonds issued by government-related issuers are assessed based on 1) the eligibility of the related sovereign referencing the methodology used in assessing the eligibility of government bonds and 2) the alignment of the government-related issuers’ primary activities to the SDGs. If the issuer has corporate like primary activity, the SDG alignment is assessed

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against the Investment Advisers eligibility process for companies as described above. If the issuer has non-corporate like primary activity, its primary activity is assessed against certain pre-defined categories which are deemed to be aligned to the SDGs, or on a case-by-case basis. Examples of such pre-defined categories include Development Finance Institutions (Institutions providing capital for economic development projects) and Housing Related (Institutions contributing to the provision of affordable housing).

In general, the Fund will seek to invest at least 45% of its net asset value in equities and at least 25% of its net asset value in Investment Grade Bonds¹ issued by corporates, sovereigns and supranational issuers (including money market instruments). However, the Fund is not expected to invest more than 10% of its net asset value in debt securities issued and/or guaranteed by a single sovereign issuer (including its government, public or local authority) that is rated below investment grade. In the event of split ratings among internationally recognised credit agencies, the highest credit rating accredited to the relevant sovereign issuer shall be deemed the reference credit rating for this purpose.

The Fund may invest in mortgage- and asset-backed securities which will not exceed 15% of the net asset value of the Fund. In addition, the Fund may invest not more than 5% of its net asset value in debt instruments with loss-absorption features, such as contingent convertible bonds, including certain types of additional Tier 1 and Tier 2 capital bonds, which are subject to contingent write-down or contingent conversion to ordinary shares on the occurrence of trigger event(s), and up to 2% of its net asset value in distressed securities².

The Fund may invest up to 5% of its net asset value in the China Interbank Bond Market either directly or via Bond Connect. The Fund may also invest, either directly e.g. via the Shanghai-Hong Kong Stock Connect and the Shenzhen-Hong Kong Stock Connect and/or indirectly such as by way of access warrants and/or other access products, into China A-Shares on an ancillary basis.

The Fund may invest up to 30% in Emerging Markets.

No more than 15% of the net asset value of the Fund will be used for lending securities. The level of exposure to securities lending is generally expected to be less than 5% of the net asset value of the Fund.

The Fund does not enter into repo, reverse repo or other similar over-the-counter (OTC) transactions. The Fund may use financial derivative instruments for investment purposes, hedging and/or efficient portfolio management. Instruments permitted are interest rate swaps, credit default swap indices, credit default swaps, forward contracts, foreign exchange options, futures and options on futures as described in more detail in the main part of the Prospectus under the "Risk Warnings" section and in Annex 1 of the Prospectus.

Up to 5% of the total net assets of the Fund may be subject to Total Return Swaps.

In order to achieve its investment goals, for treasury purposes and/or in case of unfavourable market conditions, the Fund may also invest in deposits with credit institutions, money market instruments and units of money market funds. For defensive purposes, the Fund may hold also up to 100% of its net assets in these instruments on a temporary basis.

¹ "Investment Grade Bond", for the purposes of the Fund, refers to (i) a bond which has been (or which is issued by an issuer which has been) assigned an investment grade³ credit rating; or (ii) an unrated⁴ bond deemed to be of equivalent standing by the Investment Adviser. In order to determine whether an unrated debt security is of equivalent quality, the Investment Adviser will look at the creditworthiness of the issuer of such unrated debt security. The Investment Adviser will evaluate not only an issuer's ability to repay their debt, but will also determine whether the pricing of such debt appropriately reflects the issuer's ability to repay.

² "Distressed security", for the purposes of the Fund, refers to a security with a credit rating lower than CCC- by Standard & Poor's or equivalent.

³ "Investment grade", for the purposes of the Fund, refers to a credit rating equal to or better than BBB- by Standard & Poor's or Fitch, or Baa3 by Moody's.

本基金尋求透過投資於全球公司發行的股票及債券以實現長期資本增長及保本，而投資顧問認為該等公司透過其當前或未來的產品及/或服務為環境及社會目標作出正面貢獻。本基金亦投資於其他符合投資顧問的專有資格標準的定息證券，包括政府債券。為了實現其投資目標，本基金至少 70% 的股票及債券投資符合環境及/或社會特徵。

本基金尋求投資於其產品或服務大多數符合或正轉型至更為符合聯合國可持續發展目標（「SDG」）。除了符合SDG外，各公司符合投資顧問所識別的專注於全球社會及環境挑戰的任何單一或組合的可持續投資主題（「主題」）。該等主題反映SDG，為達致經濟、社會及環境方面的可持續發展提供藍圖：

- (i) **健康與福祉**。促進健康的生活方式和福祉；
- (ii) **能源轉型**。確保人人獲得負擔得起的、可靠和可持續的能源；
- (iii) **可持續城市及社區**。以包容、可持續的方式支持城市化；
- (iv) **負責任消費及生產**。支持轉型至循環和可持續經濟；
- (v) **教育和資訊的獲取**。確保包容、優質的教育和資訊的獲取；
- (vi) **金融包容性**。增加獲得金融服務和進入市場的機會和可負擔性；及
- (vii) **清潔水源和衛生設施**。確保水源和衛生設施的可及性和可持續管理。

以上主題可能隨著時間按投資顧問的研究及/或觀點而改變。

本基金承諾維持其至少40%的投資於符合以下條件的可持續投資(i)根據業務活動與上述任何一個或一個組合的主題的一致性進行評估；及(ii)不會對任何環境或社會可持續投資目標造成任何重大損害。

公司的資格

為了識別被認為大多數「符合」或「轉型」至更為符合SDG的合資格公司，投資顧問依賴自下而上的專有研究進行評估。此資格評估以投資顧問的界別層面「特徵」（以評估某界別內的產品與服務是否對SDG帶來正面貢獻）與「標準」（研究如何生產產品和服務、重大ESG風險管理、企業管治常規的質素以及任何不利的環境或社會影響）為基礎。投資顧問一般使用收益評估業務的符合程度，惟在某些情況下，其他指標可能更為相關（例如公用事業則應用能源生產組合）。投資顧問亦考慮SDG中未有具體提及的議題、社區和群體。

投資顧問亦評估與SDG不一致的風險。倘若該等風險被釐定為重大，該公司不可被視為合資格。

- (i) 「一致」公司（「一致公司」）一般指至少50%的收益來自符合上述本基金主題的產品或服務之公司。我們認為一致公司可為環境和社會目標帶來重大的正面影響。部份公司透過彼等產品與服務自然符合主題，而且可以憑藉其大小、規模及市場佔有率產生重大的正面影響，而其他公司則為成功的行業顛覆者和創新者，其業務活動著重於解決尚未滿足的需求或應付資源不足的人口。
- (ii) 「轉型」公司（「轉型公司」）即投資顧問認為長遠而言正積極轉型其業務以更符合SDG而預期近期至中期將作出重大變更的公司。轉型公司目前的業務符合程度可能較低，惟或會大量投資於會帶來變革或尋求作出有意義的改變的創新解決方案，從而加強與SDG的一致性，並可能為全球可持續發展帶來日益增長的貢獻。尤其是就轉型公司而言，亦考慮了實現預期轉型的具體目標、發展路徑及時間表。

倘若一家公司被釐定為「一致」或「轉型」公司並且本基金已投資於該公司，惟其後被釐定為未能符合「一致」或「轉型」之要求，則一般將在此釐定之日期起六個月內出售該公司，惟須符合本基金投資者的最佳利益。

投資顧問識別相關主要績效指標(KPIs)及目標，以監控就 SDG 的進展及一致性。該等將因應界別、相關主題及公司而有所不同。一家公司的資格受到持續監測，並且大致每年均對影響論題進行更正式的「更新」。尤其是就轉型公司而言，KPIs 可包括符合一致的收益以及其他轉型指標。

此外，投資顧問應用 ESG 和規範為本排除，以在購買之時就本基金對企業發行人的投資落實負面篩選政策¹。投資顧問會依賴識別公司是否參與不符合該等篩選的活動或收益來自有關活動的第三方提供者。作為其中一部份，投資顧問排除違反聯合國全球契約(UNGC)原則的公司以及從事武器、煙草及化石燃料等商業活動的若干公司。

政府債券的資格

政府債券的資格主要透過投資顧問的專有主權 ESG 框架（「**框架**」）進行評估，該框架涵蓋一系列 ESG 指標，以評估一個國家如何妥善管理其 ESG 風險，例如：有關氣候變化的脆弱性、人類發展的層面及各種管治措施相關的指標。

框架利用來自三個數據來源的初始得分：

- 1) 環境：The Notre Dame Global Adaptation Initiative Climate Vulnerability Index；
- 2) 社會：UN Human Development Index；及
- 3) 管治：World Bank's Worldwide Governance Indicators。

投資顧問將初始得分標準化，並為每個環境、社會及管治輸入分配權重，以按絕對和經調整的國民總收入（「**經調整的國民總收入**」）基礎（如有數據）計算一個主權國家的整體 ESG 得分。為符合投資資格，政府必須符合以下標準：1) 其按絕對和經調整的國民總收入基礎取得的 ESG 得分高於預設門檻；2) 按絕對和經調整的國民總收入基礎取得的得分高於預設管治得分門檻；及 3) 符合投資顧問規定的若干人權標準。因得分低而被釐定為有所偏離的政府相關發行人被排除在本基金的投資領域之外。

此外，投資顧問應用 ESG 排除，以在購買之時就本基金對政府的投資落實負面篩選政策²。

政府相關發行人所發行的債券乃按 1) 相關主權國家的資格（參考評估政府債券資格所用的方法）及 2) 政府相關發行人的主要活動與 SDG 的一致性進行評估。倘若發行人有類似企業的主要活動，則與 SDG 的一致性乃根據上述投資顧問就公司的合資格過程進行評估。倘若發行人有類似非企業的主要活動，則其主要活動乃根據若干被視為符合 SDG 的預設類別進行評估，或根據個別情況進行評估。該等預設類別的例子包括發展融資機構（為經濟發展項目提供資本的機構）及房屋相關（致力提供經濟適用住房的機構）。

一般而言，本基金將尋求至少以其資產淨值的 45% 投資於股票及至少以其資產淨值的 25% 投資於企業、主權國家及超國家發行人發行的投資級債券¹（包括貨幣市場工具）。然而，本基金預期不會將超過其資產淨值的 10% 投資於由單一主權國發行人（包括其政府、公共或地方當局）所發行及／或擔保的評級低於投資級的債務證券。倘若國際認可的信貸機構之間出現分割評級的情況，則相關主權發行人獲得的最高信貸評級將被視為就此目的之參考信貸評級。

本基金可以不多於其資產淨值的 15% 投資於按揭抵押證券及資產抵押證券。此外，本基金可以不超過其資產淨值的 5% 投資於具有吸收虧損特點的債務工具，例如應急可換股債券，包括若干類別的額外一級和二級資本債券，其於發生觸發事件時會進行應急減記或應急轉換為普通股，以及其資產淨值的最多 2% 投資於財困證券²。

本基金最多可以其資產淨值的 5% 直接地或透過債券通投資於中國銀行間債券市場。本基金亦可直接（例如透過滬港股票市場交易互聯互通機制和深港股票市場交易互聯互通機制）及／或間接（例如以連接認股權證及／或其他連接產品的方式）投資於中國 A 股，作為輔助投資。

本基金可投資最多 30% 於新興市場。

本基金可將不多於 15% 的資產淨值用作證券借貸。一般預期證券借貸的風險水平少於本基金資產淨值的 5%。

本基金並不進行回購、反向回購或其他類似的場外(OTC)交易。本基金可運用金融衍生工具作投資目的、對沖及／或有效投資組合管理。獲准工具為利率掉期、各信貸違約掉期指數、信貸違約掉期、遠期合約、外匯期權、期貨及期貨期權，詳見發行章程主文內「風險警告」一節及附件一。

本基金總淨資產的最多 5% 可用以訂立總回報掉期。

What are the key risks? 本基金有哪些主要風險？

Investment involves risks. Please refer to the Hong Kong Offering Document for details including the risk factors.

1. General investment risk

- The Fund's investment portfolio may fall in value due to any of the key risk factors below and therefore your investment in the Fund may suffer losses. There is no guarantee of the repayment of principal.

2. Risks associated with sustainable investments

- **Subjective judgment in investment selection:** In pursuing the Fund's investment objective, the Investment Adviser considers certain environmental and social goals in the eligibility assessment process, which involves analysis of a company or issuer's alignment to the SDGs. Such assessment by the Investment Adviser is subjective in nature and therefore it is possible that the Investment Adviser may have a different interpretation of what is aligned to the SDGs and its Themes compared to another adviser. This may lead to the Fund investing in certain opportunities or foregoing investment opportunities when it might otherwise be advantageous to do so and/or selling securities when it might be disadvantageous to do so.
- **Concentration risk:** The Fund follows a sustainable investment approach, which may cause it to be overweight and/or underweight in certain sectors and thus perform differently than funds that have a similar objective but which do not incorporate sustainable investment criteria when selecting securities. The use of specific criteria mapped to SDGs may also result in the Fund being concentrated in certain companies and its value may be more volatile than that of a fund having a more diverse portfolio of investments.
- **Exclusion risk:** The use of exclusions may affect the Fund's investment performance and, as such, the Fund may perform differently compared to similar funds that do not use such criteria. ESG and norms-based exclusion criteria used in the Fund's investment strategy may result in the Fund foregoing opportunities to buy certain securities when it might otherwise be advantageous to do so, and/or selling securities due to their environmental and social characteristics when it might be disadvantageous to do so. As such, the application of exclusion criteria may restrict the ability of the Fund to acquire or dispose of its investments at a price and time that it wishes to do so, and may therefore result in a loss to the Fund.
- **Reliance on corporate data or third-party information:** When assessing a potential investment based on the Fund's sustainable investment criteria, the Investment Adviser is dependent upon information and data from the security issuer and/or third-parties (which may include providers for research, reports, exclusions, ratings and/or analysis such as index providers and consultants). Such information or data may be incomplete, inaccurate or inconsistent. As a result, there is a risk that the Investment Adviser may make an assessment of a security or issuers based on incorrect information.
- **Lack of standardised definitions:** Incorporating ESG-related considerations within the investment process is often qualitative and subjective by nature. ESG considerations may vary depending on sectors, Themes, asset classes and investment philosophy. Evaluation methodologies and the way in which different funds (including the Fund) will apply ESG criteria may vary, as there are not yet commonly agreed principles and metrics for assessing the environmental and social characteristics of investments within ESG funds. The lack of a standardised definition and the lack of a global standardised system regarding what activities qualify as sustainable may also affect the Investment Adviser's ability to measure and assess a company's contribution to environment and social goals. In addition, the lack of common or harmonised definitions and labels regarding

ESG and sustainable investment criteria may result in the risk of incorrectly or subjectively assessing a security or issuer.

- **Change in nature of investments:** The alignment of a security can change over time and may no longer meet the Fund's focus on alignment with the SDGs after its initial investments. The Investment Adviser may have to sell such security held by the Fund at a disadvantageous price. This may lead to a fall in the value of the Fund.
- **Risks associated with Transitioning Companies:** There is no universal definition or assessment to determine what Transitioning Companies amounts to and the rate at which higher positive alignment is to be made. The determination of which companies are considered to be "transitioning" depends on the assessment and judgment of the Investment Adviser. Companies which are deemed to be Transitioning Companies may need longer for their increasing positive alignment to the SDGs to be realised. The Investment Adviser may need to dispose such investments at a disadvantageous price which may lead to a fall in the value of the Fund. There can be no guarantee that the Investment Adviser will correctly assess the companies' trend of alignment with the SDGs over the longer term.

3. Equities risk

- The Fund's investment in equity securities is subject to general market risks. The prices of equity securities may change or decline in response to certain events or factors, including those directly involving the companies whose securities are owned by the Fund, overall market changes, changes in investment sentiment, local, regional or global political, social or economic instability, conditions or changes and currency fluctuations.
- Some securities exchanges may have the right to suspend or limit trading in any security traded on the relevant exchange. The government or the regulators may also implement policies that may affect the financial markets. All these may have a negative impact on the Fund.

4. Bonds/debt securities risk

- The Fund is exposed to the credit/default risk of issuers of the bonds and other debt securities in its portfolio. The market value of bonds generally varies inversely with the level of interest rates – when interest rates rise, their values will tend to decline and vice versa.
- The credit rating of a debt security (or its issuer), including an Investment Grade Bond, may subsequently be downgraded. In the event of such downgrading, the value of the Fund may be adversely affected. The Investment Adviser may or may not be able to dispose of such downgraded securities at favourable prices or at all.
- Credit ratings assigned by rating agencies are subject to limitations and do not guarantee the creditworthiness of the security and/or the issuer at all times.
- The Fund's investment in securities issued or guaranteed by governments may be exposed to political, social and economic risks. In adverse situations, the sovereign issuers may not be able or willing to repay the principal and/or interest when due or may request the Fund to participate in restructuring such debts. The Fund may suffer significant losses when there is a default of sovereign debt issuers.

5. Emerging markets risk

- The Fund invests in emerging markets securities which may involve increased risks and special considerations not typically associated with investment in more developed markets, such as liquidity risks, currency risks/control, political and economic uncertainties, legal and taxation risks, settlement risks, custody risk and the likelihood of a high degree of volatility. In particular, settlement systems in emerging markets are less well organised than those of developed markets. Thus, settlement may be delayed and cash or securities belonging to the Fund may be in jeopardy.

6. Risk associated with collateralised and/or securitised products

- The Fund may invest in mortgage and asset backed securities which may be highly illiquid and prone to substantial price volatility. These instruments may be subject to greater credit, liquidity and interest rate risks compared to other debt securities. They are often exposed to extension and prepayment risks and risks that the payment obligations relating to the underlying assets are not met, which may adversely impact the returns of the securities.

7. Currency risk

- Underlying investments of the Fund, and certain classes of shares of the Fund, may be denominated in currencies other than the base currency of the Fund. The net asset value of the Fund may be adversely affected by fluctuations in the exchange rates between these currencies and the base currency, and by changes in exchange rate controls.

8. Valuation risk

- Valuation of the Fund's investments may involve uncertainties and judgemental determinations. If such valuations are incorrect, this may affect the net asset value calculation of the Fund.

9. Liquidity risk

- Certain securities, such as unlisted securities and/or some securities traded in over-the-counter markets, may be deemed less liquid if they cannot be readily sold without significantly impacting their value, or may become difficult or impossible to sell, particularly during times of market turmoil. Liquidity may be impacted by the lack of an active market for a security, legal or contractual restrictions on resale, or the reduced number and capacity of market participants to make a market in such security. Market prices for less liquid securities may be volatile or difficult to determine, and reduced liquidity may have an adverse impact on the market price of such securities. During times of market turmoil, there have been, and may be, no buyers or sellers for securities in entire asset classes. Additionally, the sale of less liquid securities may involve substantial delays (including delays in settlement) and additional costs and the Fund may have more difficulty to sell such securities when necessary to meet its liquidity needs, or try to limit losses, or may be forced to sell at a loss.

10. Counterparty risk

- Other financial institutions provide services to the Fund such as safekeeping of assets or may serve as counterparties to financial contracts such as derivatives. There is a risk a counterparty will not meet its obligations and/or default.

11. Currency hedged share classes risk

- The currency hedging process used with currency hedged share classes may not give a precise hedge and there is no guarantee that hedging will be totally successful. Returns of such classes may be significantly different over time than those of unhedged classes and the hedging may limit the ability of these classes to benefit from the currency diversification undertaken within the Fund's portfolio. Hedging at the Fund level will preclude investors from benefitting from appreciation of the non-USD currencies against USD, the base currency of the Fund. Investors in currency hedged classes bear the associated costs and may also be exposed to the risks associated with the instruments used in the hedging process.

12. Derivative instruments risk

- While the Fund may use derivative instruments in a prudent manner and for investment purposes, hedging and/or efficient portfolio management, derivative instruments may expose the Fund to additional risks related to the credit risks of the counterparty and potential for increased volatility and reduced liquidity in comparison to the underlying security positions. Derivatives are also subject to valuation risk, over-the-counter transaction risk, operational risk, legal risk and any leveraging effect can result in a loss significantly greater than the amount invested in the derivative by the Fund. Exposure to derivatives may lead to a high risk of significant loss by the Fund.

13. Dividend risk

- There is no assurance that dividends will be declared and paid in respect of the underlying investments held by the Fund. The rates of dividend payment in respect of such securities may be affected by factors beyond the control of the Management Company.

14. Sustainability risk

- Sustainability risks refer to an environmental, social or governance event or condition that, if it occurs, could cause an actual or a potential material negative impact on the value of the investments of a Fund. Sustainability risks for the Fund (and/or companies in which the Fund invests in) may include, but are not limited to, the following: climate change risk where, depending on the Fund's operational footprint, increased exposure to physical climate risks such as extreme weather events create a more volatile operating backdrop for companies and put countries growth under pressure; data security risk where vulnerability to data theft or leakage could have a significant impact on consumer trust and result in a loss of market share for companies, and the associated repercussions; governance risks where shortcomings in board composition, independence, ethical standards or shareholder rights protection could lead to unanticipated losses for a company; human capital risks;

supply chains risks; lobbying and business ethics risks which pose regulatory and financial risks; risks from exposure to historic controversies; and other and emerging sustainability risks. The Fund's asset value may be adversely affected as a result of the above mentioned risks.

1. 一般投資風險

- 本基金的投資組合的價值可能因以下任何主要風險因素而下跌，因此閣下在本基金的投資或會蒙受損失。概不保證付還本金。

2. 與可持續投資有關的風險

- **投資選擇的主觀判斷：**在追求本基金的投資目標時，投資顧問在資格評估過程中考慮若干環境及社會目標，當中涉及就一家公司或發行人與SDG的一致性的分析。投資顧問進行有關評估屬於主觀性質，因此投資顧問對與SDG及其主題的一致性的詮釋可能有別於其他顧問對其之理解。這可能導致本基金投資於若干機會，或在可能有利的情況下放棄投資機會，及／或在可能不利的情況下出售證券。
- **集中風險：**本基金遵循可持續投資方針，這可能導致其在某些界別的比重過多及／或比重不足，從而與具有類似目標惟在挑選證券時不納入可持續投資標準的基金表現不同。使用反映SDG的特定標準亦可能導致本基金集中投資於若干公司，而相比擁有更多元化的投資組合的基金，其價值可能更為波動。
- **排除風險：**運用排除可能影響本基金的投資表現，故此本基金的表現可能有別於未有運用該等標準的類似基金。本基金投資策略所使用的ESG和規範為本排除標準可能導致本基金放棄在可能有利的情況下購買若干證券的機會，及／或在可能不利的情況下因其環境及社會特徵而出售證券。因此，排除標準的應用可能會限制本基金以其心儀的價格與時間收購或出售其投資的能力，故本基金可能蒙受損失。
- **對企業數據或第三方資料的依賴：**在根據本基金的可持續投資標準評估潛在投資時，投資顧問會依賴來自證券發行人及／或第三方（可能包括研究、報告、排除、評級及／或分析的提供者，例如指數提供者及顧問）的資料及數據。有關資料或數據可能不完整、不準確或不一致。因此，存在投資顧問可能根據不正確的資料對證券或發行人進行評估的風險。
- **缺乏標準化定義：**將 ESG 相關考慮因素納入投資過程往往是定性和主觀的。ESG考慮因素視乎界別、主題、資產類別及投資理念而可能不同。不同基金（包括本基金）應用ESG標準的評估方法和方式可能有所不同，因為目前尚未有一致同意的原則與指標以評估ESG基金的投資的環境與社會特徵。缺乏標準化定義及缺乏全球標準化系統以釐定哪些活動屬於可持續亦可能影響投資顧問衡量及評估一家公司對環境和社會目標的貢獻的能力。此外，缺乏有關ESG及可持續投資標準的共同或統一定義和標籤可能導致對證券或發行人作出錯誤或主觀評估的風險。
- **投資性質的變更：**證券的一致性可能會隨著時間的推移而變化，並可能在初始投資後不再符合本基金與 SDG 保持一致的重點。投資顧問可能須以不利的價格出售本基金持有的該證券。這可能導致本基金價值下跌。
- **與轉型公司有關的風險：**沒有通用的定義或評估以釐定轉型公司的意義以及實現更為正面的貢獻的速度。釐定哪些公司被視為「轉型」取決於投資顧問的評估與判斷。被視為轉型公司的公司可能需要更長時間方可體現與SDG的一致性。投資顧問可能須以不利的價格出售有關投資，這可能導致本基金價值下跌。無法保證投資顧問可長期正確評估公司符合SDG的趨向。

3. 股票風險

- 本基金於股本證券的投資須承受一般市場風險。股本證券的價格可因應若干事件或因素而改變或下跌，包括直接涉及本基金所擁有證券所屬公司的事件或因素、整體市場變化、投資氣氛改變、地方、地區或環球政治、社會或經濟不穩定、狀況或變化及貨幣波動。
- 部分證券交易所可能有權暫停或限制在有關交易所買賣的任何證券的交易。政府或監管機構亦可實施影響金融市場的政策。以上各項均可能對本基金產生負面的影響。

4. 債券／債務證券風險

- 本基金須承受其投資組合內的債券及其他債務證券發行人的信貸/違約風險。債券的市值一般與利率水平成反比變化－利率上升時，債券的價值傾向下跌，反之亦然。

- 債務證券(或其發行人)(包括投資級債券)的信貸評級其後可能調降。在評級調降的情況下，本基金的價值可能受到不利的影響。投資顧問也許能夠或不能夠以有利的價格沽售該等評級被調降的證券，或根本不能沽售。
- 由評級機構評定的信貸評級受到限制，並不保證證券及/或發行人在任何時候的信用可靠性。
- 本基金投資於由政府發行或擔保的證券可能須承受政治、社會及經濟的風險。在不利的情况下，該等主權國發行人未必能夠或願意如期償還本金及/或利息，或會要求本基金參與債務重組。在主權國債發行人出現違約的情況時，本基金可能蒙受巨額損失。

5. 新興市場風險

- 本基金投資於新興市場證券，可能涉及投資於發展較為成熟的市場所不常見的較高風險及特殊考慮因素，例如流動性風險、貨幣風險/管制、政治及經濟不確定性、法律及稅務風險、結算風險、保管風險及高度波動的可能性。特別是，新興市場的結算系統並不及已發展市場般穩健完善。因此，可能出現結算延誤的情況，而屬於本基金的現金或證券可能受損。

6. 與抵押化及/或證券化產品有關的風險

- 本基金可投資於按揭及資產抵押證券，這些證券的流動性可能極低，以及更容易出現價格大幅波動的情況。與其他債務證券相比，這些工具可能承受更大的信貸、流動性及利率風險。這些工具經常須承受延期及提前還款風險，以及未能履行與相關資產有關的付款責任的風險，而所有這些因素都可能對證券的回報有不利的影響。

7. 貨幣風險

- 本基金的相關投資及本基金若干股份類別可能以本基金基礎貨幣以外的貨幣計值。本基金的資產淨值可能因這些貨幣與基礎貨幣之間匯率的波動及外匯管制的變化而受到不利的影響。

8. 估值風險

- 本基金的投資的估值可能涉及不確定性及判定性的決定。如估值不正確，可能影響本基金的資產淨值計算。

9. 流動性風險

- 某些證券（例如非上市證券及/或在場外交易市場買賣的部份證券）可能被視為流動性較低，因不能在不對其價值產生重大影響之情況下隨時出售，或可能難以或無法出售，特別是在市場動盪時期。某證券缺乏活躍市場、法律或合約對轉售的限制，或為該證券造市的市場參與者的數目和能力降低都可能影響流動性。流動性較低的證券的市場價格可能較波動或難以釐定，而降低的流動性可能對該等證券的市場價格造成不利的影響。在市場動盪時期，整個資產類別的證券曾及可能沒有買家或賣家。此外，出售流動性較低的證券可能涉及重大延誤(包括結算的延誤)及額外費用，本基金可能較難在必要時出售該等證券以應付其流動資金需要，或嘗試限制虧損，或被迫在虧損的情況下出售。

10. 交易對手風險

- 其他財務機構會向本基金提供諸如資產保管等服務或擔任諸如衍生工具等財務合約的交易對手。可能出現交易對手不履行責任及/或違約的風險。

11. 貨幣對沖股份類別風險

- 就貨幣對沖股份類別採用的貨幣對沖程序未必可提供精確的對沖，概不保證會完全成功對沖。該等類別的回報隨著時間推移，可能與無對沖類別的回報有重大差別，而對沖可能局限這些類別受惠於本基金的投資組合所進行的貨幣多元化的能力。在本基金層面進行對沖將妨礙投資者受惠於非美元貨幣兌美元(即本基金的基礎貨幣)的升值。貨幣對沖類別的投資者須承擔有關費用，並可能須承受與對沖程序所用工具有關的風險。

12. 衍生工具風險

- 雖然本基金可以審慎方式而且為進行投資、對沖及/或有效組合管理而運用衍生工具，但衍生工具可能使本基金承受交易對手的信貸風險及相比於相關證券持倉而言，波動性可能增加及流動性較低等額外風險。衍生工具亦須承受估值風險、場外交易風險、營運風險、法律風險，而任何槓桿效應都可導致本基金所蒙受的損失遠高於其投資於衍生工具的款額。衍生工具的投資可導致本基金承受巨額損失的高風險。

13. 股息風險

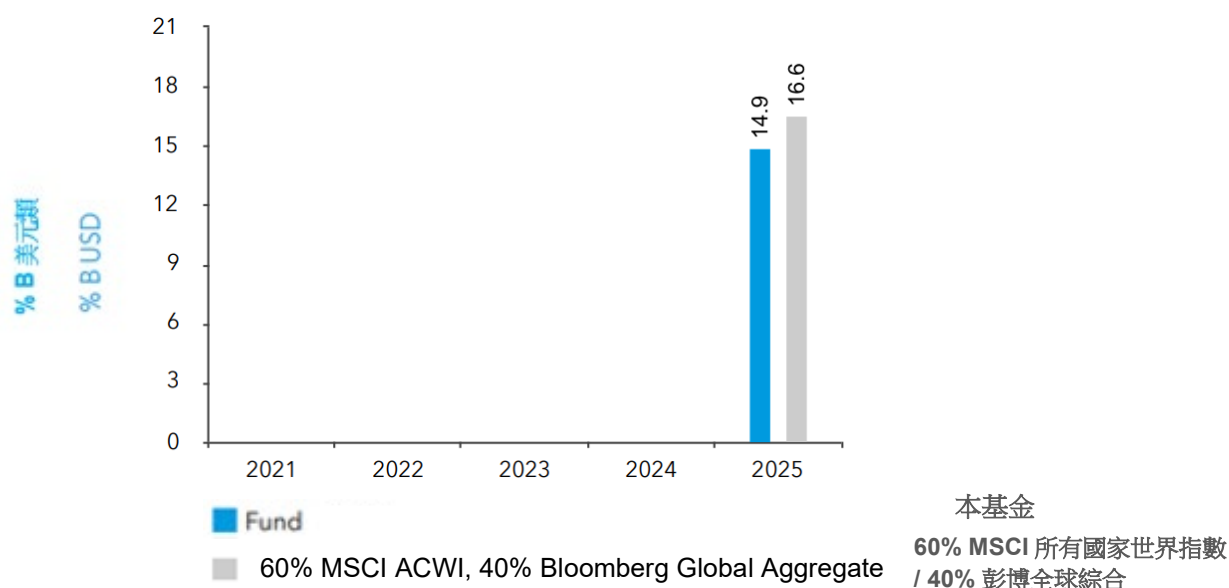
14. 可持續性風險
