

Purpose

This document provides you with key information about this investment product. It is not marketing material. The information is required by law to help you understand the nature, risks, costs, potential gains and losses of this product and to help you compare it with other products.

Product

Capital Group Emerging Markets Debt Fund (LUX) (the "fund"), a sub-fund of Capital International Fund SICAV, Class Z EUR (LU0815114383)

The Commission de Surveillance du Secteur Financier ("CSSF") is responsible for supervising Capital International Management Company Sàrl (the "Manager"), part of Capital Group, in relation to this Key Information Document. The fund is authorised in Luxembourg. The Manager is authorised in Luxembourg and regulated by the CSSF. 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What is this product?

Type

This fund is a sub-fund of Capital International Fund, an open-ended Luxembourg SICAV (Société d'Investissement à Capital Variable), qualifying as a UCITS.

Term

This fund does not have a maturity date. The manufacturer is not entitled to terminate the fund unilaterally, however, as described in the fund's prospectus, liquidation of the fund may be approved by the board of directors of the company and/or by a resolution at a separate fund meeting of shareholders of the fund concerned.

Investment objective

To provide, over the long term, a high level of total return, of which a large component is current income. The fund invests primarily in government and corporate bonds, denominated in various currencies, of issuers in eligible investment countries. Securities of Emerging Markets issuers are defined as those: (1) from issuers in emerging markets; (2) that are denominated in emerging markets currencies; or (3) that are from issuers deemed to be suitable for the fund because they have or are expected to have significant economic exposure to emerging markets (through assets, revenues, or profits). These are usually listed or traded on other regulated markets. Unlisted securities may also be purchased.

The fund may invest up to 10% of its assets in securities of issuers which are not emerging markets issuers. Notwithstanding the above 10% limit, the fund may invest in debt instruments from issuers such as the US Treasury or other sovereign issuers that, in the opinion of the Investment Adviser, are of equivalent or higher quality, without being considered as securities of issuers from countries other than eligible investment countries.

In addition to the integration of sustainability risks as part of the investment adviser's investment decision making process, the investment adviser also evaluates and applies ESG and norms-based screening to implement a negative screening policy relating to the fund's investments in corporate and sovereign issuers.

The fund may invest up to 10% in distressed securities. The fund's level

of leverage is expected to be 100% of the net assets of the fund, as calculated using the sum of the notionals, not taking into account any netting of the derivatives and hedging arrangements that the fund has in place at any time. Under certain circumstances (e.g. very low market volatility), the actual fund's level of leverage may increase from time to time to higher levels.

Intended retail investor

The fund is actively managed and particularly suitable for investors who are seeking:

- current income and the potential for long-term high total returns through investment primarily in Emerging Markets government and corporate Bonds and understand and accept the high level of risks associated with such an investment;
- to consider environmental, social and/or governance criteria as part of their investments within the meaning of Article 8 of the SFDR. As investments carry a risk of loss, an investor should have a basic knowledge of financial instruments to understand related risks, which are defined in the fund's 'What are the risks and what could I get in return?' section. The fund is appropriate for investors with a medium to long-term investment horizon and does not require prior experience with PRIIPs or similar investments.

This fund is an actively managed UCITS. It is not managed in reference to a benchmark. Any information in relation to an index is provided for the purposes of risk management, context and illustration, as applicable.

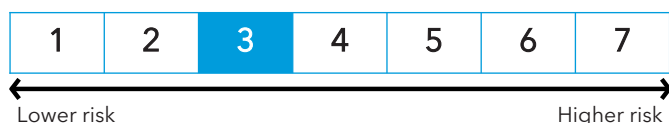

Investors in the fund may buy and sell shares on any dealing day (as defined in the Prospectus). If you invest in a distributing share class, income from investments will be paid out to you. If you invest in an accumulating share class, income will be re-invested.

What are the risks and what could I get in return?

Risk indicator



The risk indicator assumes you keep the product for 5 years.

The summary risk indicator is a guide to the level of risk of this product compared to other products. It shows how likely it is that the product will lose money because of movements in the markets or because we are not able to pay you.

We have classified this product as 3 out of 7, which is a medium-low risk class.

This figure rates the likelihood of losing money in the future, based on the Net Asset Value of this Share Class over the last ten years as a medium-low risk.

Be aware of currency risk. If you select a foreign currency share class, you will be exposed to currency risk, receive payments in a different currency to your local currency and your final return will depend on the exchange rate between these two currencies. This risk is not considered in the indicator shown above.

Investments in the fund are subject to general investment risks, such as market, counterparty and liquidity risks. Any specific risks to this fund are detailed in the prospectus.

What happens if Capital International Management Company Sàrl is unable to pay out?

The fund's assets are held in safekeeping by its depositary, J.P. Morgan SE, Luxembourg Branch (the 'Depositary'). In the event of the insolvency of the Manager, the fund's assets in the safekeeping of the Depositary will not be affected. In the event of the Depositary's insolvency, the fund may suffer a financial loss. However, this risk is mitigated to some extent by the fact the Depositary is required by law and regulation to segregate its own assets from the assets of the fund. Your investment is not covered by the Luxembourg compensation scheme.

What are the costs?

The person advising on or selling you this product may charge you other costs. If so, this person will provide you with information about these costs and they will affect your investment.

Costs over time

The tables show the amounts that are taken from your investment to cover different types of costs. These amounts depend on how much you invest and how long you hold the product. The amounts shown here are illustrations based on an example investment amount and different possible investment periods.

We have assumed:

- In the first year you would get back the amount that you invested (0% annual return). For the other holding periods we have assumed the product performs as shown in the moderate scenario.
- EUR 10 000.00 is invested.
